

A Level Geography Summer Work 2019

This work is preparation for the 'Changing Places' unit of work which will be taught in September. The Eduqas exam board specify that we should focus on our 'home place' as much as possible, which will be Salisbury (I realise that some of you may live up to 25 miles from the city).

Task

To produce a socio-economic profile of Salisbury using statistics from the websites listed below. The profile can be produced as a Powerpoint presentation (printed off for your notes) which will be used during the first lesson in September.

Include the following:

- a location map of the city (<https://digimapforschools.edina.ac.uk/>) username: SP12ED password: rieved82
- photographs that represent the image of Salisbury (<https://www.geograph.org.uk/>)
- employment statistics (<https://www.nomisweb.co.uk/>)
- health, housing and education statistics – (<http://datashine.org.uk>) – screenshot any relevant maps
- population statistics (<https://www.ons.gov.uk/>)
- crime statistics (<https://www.police.uk/>)
- house prices (<https://www.zoopla.co.uk/>)
- stories that link to the local services and economy (<http://www.salisburyjournal.co.uk/>)

For some of the data you may need to use either a postcode (google a company located in the centre of Salisbury) or have to use statistics for South Wiltshire.

Please ensure that your presentation is easily accessible (bring it in on a memory stick) and that you print a copy for your notes ready for the first lesson in September.
