The first book in the bestselling Conqueror series featuring Genghis Khan and his descendants.

Robert Ludlum The Bourne Identity

Who is Jason Bourne? Why does he have four million dollars in a Swiss bank account? They are good questions. Jason has lost his memory and his search to find out who he is and what he has done starts with one clue: somebody wants him dead.

Andy McNab Cross Fire

Nick Stone is body-guarding a TV crew on the streets of war-torn Basra when his life is saved by a reporter's swift action as a roadside bomb explodes. When the man later vanishes, Stone is asked to find him. The trail leads from Iraq to Bermuda, London and Kabul...but Nick finds that instead of the hunter he becomes the hunted.

Mal Peet Keeper

Chris Ryan Blackout

Despite the doctor's best intentions, the experiment goes horribly wrong in a timeless tale about the hazards of playing creator.

J R R Tolkien The Fellowship of the Ring

The first part of Tolkien's epic masterpiece, The Lord of the Rings. Sauron, the Dark Lord, has gathered to him all the Rings of Power, the means by which he intends to rule Middle-earth. All he lacks in his plans for dominion is the One Ring, the ring that rules them all, which has fallen into the hands of the hobbit, Bilbo Baggins.

Rachel Ward Numbers

Since her mother's death, fifteen-year-old Jem has kept a secret. When her eyes meet someone else's, a number pops into her head; the date on which they will die.
