

**BISHOP WORDSWORTH'S CHURCH OF ENGLAND GRAMMAR SCHOOL FOR BOYS**  
**PUPIL PREMIUM STATEMENT 2019**

**What is pupil premium?** The pupil premium is additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers.

Our commitment to inclusion means that we do not wish to accentuate the factors that trigger Free School Meals and Pupil Premium. We therefore provide necessary support as unobtrusively as possible to ensure that qualifying pupils ultimately develop the inner confidence to take control of their own learning.

**How much?** In 2019-20 we will receive £935 for each boy registered as eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years.

**Service Premium.** The service premium is designed to support children with parents serving in the regular British armed forces. Pupils attract the premium if one of their parents is currently serving or has served in the regular armed forces in the last 3 years, or one of their parents died while serving in the armed forces and the pupil is in receipt of a pension under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme (AFCS) and the War Pensions Scheme (WPS).

**How much?** In 2019-20 we will receive £300 for each eligible pupil.

**Performance.** The progress of students receiving Pupil Premium funding is tracked throughout the year to ensure that they are making progress in line with expectations and in line with the other students in the school.

**Expenditure.** According to the Department for Education schools have the freedom to spend the funding as they see fit based upon their knowledge of pupil needs - *'Schools will decide how to use the Pupil Premium as they are best placed to assess what additional provision be made for individual pupils.'*
